# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, AMENDING SECTION 6.06.010 DANGEROUS DOG DEFINITIONS OF THE GRANDVIEW MUNICIPAL CODE TO COMPLY WITH LAWS OF 2019, ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 1026

WHEREAS, during the 2019 regular session, the Washington State Legislature enacted House Bill ("HB") 1026 concerning breed-based dog regulations; and

WHEREAS, HB 1026 requires the City to amend its dangerous dog ordinance, codified at Chapter 6.06 of the Grandview Municipal Code; and

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Grandview Municipal Code Section 6.06.010, Definitions, which currently reads as follows:

The following words and phrases, whenever used in this chapter, shall be construed as defined in this section:

#### A. "Dangerous dog" means:

- 1. Any dog with a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury to, or to otherwise endanger the safety of humans or other domestic animals; or
- 2. Any dog which attacks a human being or other domestic animal without provocation; or
- 3. Any dog known by the owner to be a pit bull terrier, which shall herein be defined as any American Pit Bull Terrier or Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier breed of dog or any mixed breed of dog which contains as an element of its breeding the breed of American Pit Bull Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier as to be identifiable as partially of the breed of American Pit Bull Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier; or
- 4. Any dog that frequently or habitually snarls or growls at or snaps at or jumps upon or threatens persons lawfully upon the public sidewalks, streets, alleys, or public places of the city; or
  - 5. Any dog known by the owner to be a wolf or wolf-hybrid.
- B. "Owner" means any person or legal entity having a possessory property right in a dog or who harbors, cares for, exercises control over, or knowingly permits any animal to remain on the premises occupied by them.
- C. A dangerous dog is "unconfined" if such dog is not securely confined indoors or confined in a securely enclosed and locked pen or structure upon the premises of the owner of such dog. Such pen or structure must have secure sides and a

secure top. If the pen or structure has no bottom secured to the sides, the sides must be embedded into the ground no less than one foot.

D. The structure or pen described in subsection C of this section may be inspected by the animal control officer or any police officer to make sure such pen or structure complies with the requirements of this chapter.

#### is hereby amended to read as follows:

The following words and phrases, whenever used in this chapter, shall be construed as defined in this section:

#### A. "Dangerous dog" means:

- 1. Any dog with a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury to, or to otherwise endanger the safety of humans or other domestic animals: or
- 2. Any dog which attacks a human being or other domestic animal without provocation; or
- 3. Except as otherwise required by subjection (E) of this section, any dog known by the owner to be a pit bull terrier, which shall herein be defined as any American Pit Bull Terrier or Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier breed of dog or any mixed breed of dog which contains as an element of its breeding the breed of American Pit Bull Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier as to be identifiable as partially of the breed of American Pit Bull Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier or American Staffordshire Terrier; or
- 4. Any dog that frequently or habitually snarls or growls at or snaps at or jumps upon or threatens persons lawfully upon the public sidewalks, streets, alleys, or public places of the city; or
  - 5. Any dog known by the owner to be a wolf or wolf-hybrid.
- B. "Owner" means any person or legal entity having a possessory property right in a dog or who harbors, cares for, exercises control over, or knowingly permits any animal to remain on the premises occupied by them.
- C. A dangerous dog is "unconfined" if such dog is not securely confined indoors or confined in a securely enclosed and locked pen or structure upon the premises of the owner of such dog. Such pen or structure must have secure sides and a secure top. If the pen or structure has no bottom secured to the sides, the sides must be embedded into the ground no less than one foot.
- D. The structure or pen described in subsection C of this section may be inspected by the animal control officer or any police officer to make sure such pen or structure complies with the requirements of this chapter.
- E. Subsection (A)(3) of this section shall not apply to a pit bull terrier, as defined therein, that has passed the American Kennel Club canine good citizen test or a reasonably equivalent canine behavioral test for a period of two years

from the date of the test. Prior to the expiration of two years, the owner may demonstrate that the pit bull terrier has re-taken the test or an equivalent test in order to maintain the exemption. Failure by a pit bull terrier to pass the American Kennel Club canine good citizen test or a reasonably equivalent canine behavioral test shall not preclude a pit bull terrier from re-taking the test at a later date for purposes of qualifying for the exemption described in this section. A pit bull terrier that has passed the American Kennel Club canine good citizen test or a reasonably equivalent canine behavioral test may nevertheless be designated a "dangerous dog" pursuant to subsections (A)(1), (2) or (4) of this section. A pit bull terrier that has been designated a "dangerous dog" pursuant to subsections (A)(1), (2) or (4) of this section shall maintain that designation regardless of whether the pit bull terrier subsequently passes the American Kennel Club canine good citizen test or a reasonably equivalent canine behavioral test.

**Section 4.** Except as set forth herein, all other provisions of Chapter 6.06 Grandview Municipal Code remain unchanged.

**Section 5.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect five days after its passage and publication as required by law.

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING THE BUDGET AND CONFIRMING TAX LEVIES FOR REVENUE TO CARRY ON THE GOVERNMENT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2020

WHEREAS, the City Clerk did publish notice that the Council of the City of Grandview, Washington, would meet on the 26th day of November, 2019, at 7:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers of the City Hall of said City for the purpose of making and adopting the budget for the fiscal year 2020, and confirming a tax levy based upon the same fiscal year, and giving taxpayers within the limits of said City an opportunity to be heard upon said budget; and

WHEREAS, said City Council did meet at said time and place and did then consider the matter of said proposed budget and tax levy, no objections to the same having been filed with the City Clerk, and no persons appearing to make objections to the same, the Council concluded that the budget was in accord with the needs of the citizens of Grandview; and

WHEREAS, said proposed budget does not exceed the lawful limits of taxation allowed by law to be levied on the property of the City of Grandview for the purposes set forth in said budget, being all necessary to carry on the government of said City during said period,

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, as follows:

**SECTION I.** That the City Council of the City of Grandview hereby adopts by reference the 2020 Annual Budget, which is on file in the Office of the City Clerk of Grandview. That required expenditures for the various departments and needs and operation of government of the City of Grandview, Washington, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2020, are fixed in the following amounts, to-wit:
