GRANDVIEW CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE MEETING MINUTES SEPTEMBER 14, 2021

1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Mayor Gloria Mendoza called the Committee-of-the-Whole meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

The meeting was held in person and was also available via teleconference.

2. ROLL CALL

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

<u>Eagle Scout Project</u> – Darrel Franworth of Boy Scout Troop 643, presented a proposal to construct horseshoe pits at Eastside Park for his Eagle Scout project.

Council concurred with the project and agreed for him to proceed.

4. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. <u>American Rescue Plan Act – Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program for Long-Term Benefits – Chris Wickenhagen, YVCOG Executive Director</u>

Chris Wickenhagen, Executive Director with the Yakima Valley Conference of Governments (YVCOG), presented the Infrastructure Revolving Loan (IRL) program for long-term benefits that would remove a huge barrier to development. The program would provide short-term, low interest loans to developers and YVCOG members to fund the construction of infrastructure for housing. The initial start-up costs would include the following: each IRL participate would provide a minimum 20% of ARPA funds; developers would pay a low flat rate application cost for each loan; and non-profit HUD-approved housing developers would be included at no application cost. Administration of the program was outlined as follows: YVCOG staff would vet each program for ARPA compliance; YVCOG would create a Technical Advisory Committee of IRL city participants; IRL TAC would review, approve and prioritize projects for funding; and YVCOG would handle contracts, compliance and reporting. She explained that if the City was interested in participating in the IRL program, she would need to receive a letter indicating that along with the name of the City representative that would sit on the Technical Advisory Committee.

Council agreed to place this item on the next C.O.W. agenda for further consideration.

B. <u>Bulletproof Vest Purchase</u>

Police Chief Fuller explained that the Grandview Police Department for many years participated in the Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) program created by the Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Act of 1998. This was a U.S. Department of Justice initiative designed to provide a critical resource to state and local law enforcement by providing grants that cover part of the cost of bulletproof vests. Applications for grant funds were accepted in April of each year and awards were issued before October of each year. Bulletproof vests have a five-year expiration date. Every five years, Grandview PD purchases replacement vests for its officers. The current vests that the officers have expire in November 2021. It was recently discovered that the PD vests were due for replacement in 2021. Expiration dates were improperly calculated during the 2020 budget process and capitol replacement funds were not requested at that time. The cost for each vest was approximately \$1,300 plus shipping and 18 vests were needed for an estimated expenditure of \$27,000. Reimbursement from the grant program would be approximately \$8,000. Vests were one of the City's normal capital replacement items and were funded. Safariland LLC vests were an item on the State Bid Contract #03720 and no bidding would be necessary.

C. Ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of a Local Agency Financing Lease and related documentation relating to the refinancing of the costs of acquisition of certain real property

City Treasurer Cordray explained that in 2011, the City entered into an agreement with Yakima Valley College to occupy a joint library building. The cost to the City was \$750,000. This was paid by a loan, with a term of 20 years at an interest rate of 3.875%, from the Washington State Treasurer. Recently, the City Treasurer was contacted by the State Treasurer with an opportunity to refinance the remaining life of the loan to a lower interest rate of 1.0%. This could be done at no cost to the City. Given current interest rates, it was in the best interest of the City to refinance the remaining 11 years of the Library loan. The total savings within the Current Expense Fund

was estimated to be around \$70,000.

Net effect was a decrease to estimated ending fund balance.

- 1. The Contracted User may exceed the monthly contract allocation so long as the quarterly amount (3 month total) does not exceed the Quarterly Total amount listed.
- 2. The above allowable wastewater discharges are considered to be the maximum discharge for a month expressed in terms of gallons or pounds per day. They represent the average daily loading over the month based on available test data. They do not represent maximum daily discharge limits.
- 3. The discharge of toxic substances as described in paragraph 6.4 of the contract, or harmful waste as described in section 13.12.030 of the Grandview Municipal Code, is prohibited.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-13

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE JOHN AND DIANE BUETTNER ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW PURSUANT TO THE PETITION METHOD, AND INCORPORATING THE SAME WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS THEREOF, PROVIDING FOR THE ASSUMPTION OF EXISTING INDEBTEDNESS, REQUIRING SAID PROPERTY TO BE ASSESSED AND TAXED AT THE SAME RATE AND BASIS AS OTHER PROPERTY WITHIN SAID CITY, ADOPTING A COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN, AND CHANGING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY

WHEREAS, the City of Grandview, Washington received a petition for annexation, known as the John and Diane Buettner Annexation, of certain real property pursuant to RCW 35A.14.120, a legal description of which is attached hereto on Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, that said petition set forth the fact that the City Council of the City of Grandview required the assumption of City indebtedness by the area requesting to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, prior to filing of said petition, the City Council had indicated a tentative approval of said annexation; and

WHEREAS, petitioners further understood the proposed zoning of said area proposed for annexation would be M-1 Light Industrial for Parcel No. 230915-23001; and

WHEREAS, notices of hearing before the Hearing Examiner and the City Council were published in the manner as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, all property within the territory so annexed shall be subject to and is a part of the Comprehensive Plan of the City of Grandview as presently adopted or as is hereafter amended; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Grandview has determined that the best interests and general welfare of the City would be served by the annexation; and

WHEREAS, prior to the City Council taking final action, the City Clerk submitted a "Notice of Intention" to the Yakima County Boundary Review Board pursuant to RCW 36.93.090; and

WHEREAS, on September 10, 2021, the Yakima Boundary Review Board notified the City that the 45-day review period lapsed on the "Notice of Intention" and the annexation was deemed approved by the Boundary Review Board,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW DO ORDAIN, as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** There has been filed with the City Council of the City of Grandview, a petition in writing signed by property owners owning a majority of the assessed value of the property proposed for annexation hereinafter described on Exhibit "A"; that said petition set forth the fact that the City Council of the City of Grandview required the assumption of City indebtedness by the area requesting to be annexed; that prior to filing of said petition, the City Council had on March 9, 2021 agreed to consider the annexation as proposed in the Letter of Intent; and that petitioners further understood the proposed zoning of said area proposed for annexation would be M-1 Light Industrial for Parcel No. 230915-23001.
- **SECTION 2.** April 28, 2021 was set as the date for the open record public hearing before the Hearing Examiner and June 22, 2021 was set as the date for the closed record public hearing on said petition before the Grandview City Council; notice of such hearings were published in the Grandview Herald, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Grandview; notice of such hearings was also posted in three public places within the territory proposed for annexation; notice of such hearings was also mailed to owners of property within three hundred feet of the territory proposed for annexation; and said notice specified the time and place of such hearings and invited interested persons to appear and voice approval or disapproval of the annexation.
- **SECTION 3.** The territory proposed by said petition to be annexed to the City of Grandview is situated in the County of Yakima in the State of Washington, is contiguous, approximate and adjacent to the present corporate limits of said City, and is more particularly described in Exhibit "A," which is attached hereto and incorporated in full by this reference.
- **SECTION 4.** The territory set forth in this ordinance and for which said petition for annexation as filed should be and is hereby made a part of the City of Grandview.
- **SECTION 5.** Pursuant to the terms of the annexation petition, all property within this territory annexed hereby shall be assessed and taxed at the same rate and on the same basis as property within the City, including assessment or taxes in payment of any bonds issued or debts contracted prior to or existing at the date of annexation.
- **SECTION 6.** All property within the territory so annexed shall be subject to and a part of the Comprehensive Plan of the City of Grandview as presently adopted or as is hereafter amended.
- **SECTION 7.** All property within the territory so annexed shall be and hereby is zoned be M-1 Light Industrial for Parcel No. 230915-23001.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after its passage and publication as provided by law.
