1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

A. Wine Country Road Roundabout Video

Present on behalf of HLA Engineering was Mike Battle, Stephen Hazzard and Chris Cuevas.

HLA presented a draft video regarding the Wine Country Road roundabout which was prepared by the Washington State Department of Transportation.

B. <u>Pool Tank Repairs</u>

Parks & Recreation Director Chronis explained that last year during the budget process, she informed the Council that the pool tank was in need of immediate repairs. She also reported to Council that she had received a preliminary repair estimate and as a result, appropriated \$100,000 in this year's budget to complete the needed repairs. The proposed estimate was to include sand blasting, cement repairs and repainting for a construction estimate of \$133,828. She presented the revised preliminary estimates provided by HLA Engineering and Land Surveying, Inc. and Columbia Industrial Coatings. The new recommended repairs were to include pressure washing, concrete repairs and repainting in the amount of \$102,570. Staff requested Council's authorization to proceed with the repair project in order to meet the scheduled swim pool opening date of June 10, 2022.

C. Ordinance amending the 2022 Annual Budget

City Treasurer Cordray explained that staff monitoring and review of fund and department budgets identified numerous budget accounts to be amended. An ordinance was prepared to provide for the amending of the 2022 Annual Budget to accommodate the changes in sources and uses. By Fund the highlights of the budget changes were:

- Current Expense Fund: Increased appropriations for Chamber of Commerce tourism 2021, 2% support of substance abuse programs, Police Administration corrected salaries and Police Detective retirement buyout. Decreased appropriations to move one officer from this fund into the Yakima County Law & Justice Fund. Net effect was an increase to estimated ending fund balance.
- Yakima Co. Law & Justice Tax Fund: Increased appropriations to move one officer into this fund from Current Expense Fund. Net effect was a decrease to estimated ending fund balance.
- Transportation Benefit District Fund: Increased appropriations in Professional Services for the West Wine Country Road Park and Ride Improvements application. Net effect was a decrease to estimated ending fund balance.

Discussion took place.

Councilmember Everett moved to strike the Chamber support for 2021 in the amount of \$2,500 from the budget amendment. The motion died due to a lack of a second.

D. <u>2022 Budget Postponements</u>

City Treasurer Cordray explained that in November 2021, staff presented to Council 2022 Budget Recommendations that would help balance the 2022 proposed budget. At that time, staff and Council agreed to re-open/revisit the deleted budget appropriations in February 2022 after the City Treasurer presented the actual fund balances. Earlier this month, he presented a budget amendment request that was to be approved at the February 22nd Council meeting. The amendment showed a Current Expense 2022 ending fund balance of \$165,000. Within the last couple of weeks, two new items were presented that were not included in the 2022 budget: \$8,000 to Yakima County for alcohol abuse programs and a \$42,000 cash out for early retirement in the police department. There two items would bring the ending fund balance down to \$115,000. As of this week, the ending fund balance was \$170,000. In light of this new information and with ongoing police union negotiations and discussions regarding the use of ARPA funds, he recommended Council continue to postpone the budget items to a future date.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE 2021 ANNUAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, the original 2022 estimated beginning fund balances and revenues do not reflect available budget sources; and

WHEREAS, there are necessary and desired changes in uses and expenditure levels in the funds; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient sources within the funds to meet the anticipated expenditures.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the 2022 annual budget be amended to reflect the changes presented in Exhibit A.

Section 2. That the City Administrator is authorized and directed to adjust estimated revenues, expenditures and fund balances reflecting the determined changes.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) day after its passage and publication as required by law.
