The City contracted with Culbert Construction Inc., as the contractor for the Sanitary Sewer Trunk Main Replacement – Phase 2.

Change Order No. 3 Justification – This change order provides for labor and materials necessary for the demolition and haul off of existing shed which was in conflict with the improvements. This work included the excavation and haul off of native materials, placement of drain fabric, placement of drain rock, installation of perforated pipe, installation of Type-1 24-inch round catch basin, installation of 12-in ADS solid pipe draining into and out of the storm gallery, and quarry spalls around the outfall of the overflow pipe. The Change Order amount is \$73,980.00.

Change Order No. 4 Justification – This change order is intended to compensate the contractor for additional concrete work that became necessary during the construction of the project. This work included the removal and replacement of the following items: ADA ramp at Euclid intersection, 10-ft long section of sidewalk at Euclid intersection, 10ft x 20ft carport slab, 11ft x 14ft slab at Ivan Way residence (damaged during Phase 1 of this project), and a concrete slab at 2600 South Euclid. The Change Order amount is \$26,150.00

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-**

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, AMENDING SECTION 3.09 PAID HOLIDAYS OF THE PERSONNEL POLICY MANUAL

WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature adopted SHB 1016, making Juneteenth (June 19) a paid state holiday, effective July 2021; and.

WHEREAS, President Joe Biden also signed legislation into law making Juneteenth a U.S. federal holiday; and,

WHEREAS, the date of June 19 commemorates the day in 1865 when knowledge of the Emancipation Proclamation and the abolishment of slavery reached the last remaining enslaved people of Galveston, Texas,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1: Grandview Personnel Manual Section 3.09 Paid Holidays is hereby amended to read as follows:

## 3.09 Paid Holidays.

Regular Holidays - The following holidays are recognized as municipal holidays for pay purposes. Non-represented regular full-time and trial service employees have these days off with pay:

New Year's Day
Martin Luther King Day
Presidents' Day
Memorial Day
Juneteenth Day

Independence Day

January 1st
Third Monday in January
Third Monday in February
Last Monday in May
June 19<sup>th</sup> (effective 2022)

Independence Day July 4th

Labor Day First Monday in September Veterans' Day November 11th

Veterans' Day

November 11<sup>th</sup>
Thanksgiving Day

Fourth Thursda

Thanksgiving Day Fourth Thursday in November Day after Thanksgiving Day

Christmas Eve December 24<sup>th</sup> (1/2 day)

ONLY if authorized by the Mayor Christmas Day

ONLY if authorized by the Mayor December 25<sup>th</sup>

Floating Holiday Employee's Choice

When a day recognized as a holiday by the City falls on Sunday, the following Monday is observed as the holiday. When a day recognized as a holiday by the City falls on Saturday, the preceding Friday is observed as the holiday.

Religious Holiday - An employee who wishes to be excused from work in observance of a religious holiday will request approval of the absence from the Department Director. If approved, the time off is charged against vacation leave or compensatory time.

<u>Section 2</u>: Except as specifically amended herein, all other provisions of the Grandview Personnel Manual remain unchanged.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, AMENDING CHAPTER 9 LONGEVITY PAY OF THE PERSONNEL POLICY MANUAL

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Grandview adopted new longevity schedules for union personnel; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to make certain amendments to Chapter 9 Longevity Pay of the Personnel Policy Manual to provide consistency for non-union personnel,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1: Grandview Personnel Policy Manual Chapter 9 Longevity Pay, which reads as follows:

## Chapter 9 LONGEVITY PAY

**9.01** Additional Compensation. In addition to the monthly salaries to be paid to the regular full-time employees of the City there shall accrue, and be paid at the time and in the manner herein after set forth, longevity pay as follows:

5 years	1% of base pay
10 years	2% of base pay
15 years	3% of base pay
25 years	4% of base pay

Employees hired prior to January 1, 2010 that have not yet met the 10-year mark for longevity shall be grandfathered in at the old longevity rate of 1% for their 3-4 years of service and 1.5% for their 5-9 years of service. Once the employee reaches the 10-year mark, they shall follow the above chart for longevity pay.

- **9.02** <u>Initial Accrual</u>. The amounts set forth shall accrue from the first day of the calendar month following the month in which the periods above set forth have been completed.
- **9.03** When Payable. The accrued amount payable to any employee, shall be paid to such employee on November 30<sup>th</sup> in each year, provided, however, that should any employee entitled to additional compensation as provided in this chapter leave the employment of the City prior to November 30<sup>th</sup> in any year, the accrued, and unpaid, benefits for such employee shall be paid at the time of the termination of his employment.

## is hereby amended to read as follows:

# Chapter 9 LONGEVITY PAY

**9.01** Additional Compensation. In addition to the monthly salaries to be paid to the regular full-time employees of the City there shall accrue, and be paid at the time and in the manner herein after set forth, longevity pay as follows:

5 years	1.5% of base pay
10 years	2.5% of base pay
15 years	3.5% of base pay
20 years	4.5% of base pay

Employees hired prior to January 1, 2010 that have not yet met the 10-year mark for longevity shall be grandfathered in at the old longevity rate of 1% for their 3-4 years of service and 1.5% for their 5-9 years of service. Once the employee reaches the 10-year mark, they shall follow the above chart for longevity pay.

- **9.02** <u>Initial Accrual</u>. The amounts set forth shall accrue from the first day of the calendar month following the month in which the periods above set forth have been completed.
- **9.03** When Payable. The accrued amount payable to any employee, shall be paid monthly based on yearly gross salary, for each employee.

<u>Section 2</u>: Except as specifically amended herein, all other provisions of the Grandview Personnel Manual remain unchanged.
