# GRANDVIEW CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE MEETING MINUTES JULY 26, 2022

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

#### 3. PUBLIC COMMENT

<u>Chamber of Commerce</u> – Cody Goeppner, Chamber of Commerce Board, thanked the ARPA Group for meeting with the Chamber of Commerce on July 14<sup>th</sup> to discuss the ARPA funding allocation and process.

He announced the upcoming community events, as follows:

## 4. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

# A. Ordinance amending Grandview Municipal Code Section 16.28.080 Street Lighting

City Administrator Arteaga explained that when a developer divides property for the purpose of constructing residences, the developer must comply with the subdivision requirements of the Grandview Municipal Code (GMC). GMC Section 16.20.048 requires the developer to install new water and sewer mains, irrigation systems, streets with curb/gutter, sidewalks and street lighting.

This year, a developer challenged the street lighting requirement. GMC 16.28.080 states that the "lights shall be installed with the initial capital cost at the City's expense." In order to clarify the requirement, staff recommends Council amend GMC Section 16.28.080 to clearly identify that the developer is responsible for the entire cost of installing all new street lights for any new residential subdivision.

Discussion took place.

# B. Resolution waiving the requirements of the State bid law to allow a purchase involving special facilities or market conditions

City Administrator Arteaga explained that in 1998, the City purchased a 1977 used boom truck from military surplus for approximately \$500. This vehicle was used in numerous departments whenever there was a need to lift a heavy pump/motor for maintenance purposes. This year, the truck started having numerous maintenance related problems and now parts were not available. The unit was also considered unsafe, obsolete and needs to be replaced. To purchase a new boom truck, similar to this unit, would cost approximately \$250,000. Staff located a used 2009 Freightliner M2 auger/crane in Oregon with approximately 32,000 miles and 1,300 running hours on the PTO system. This truck was available for purchase earlier in the year at a price of \$59,995. Council approved a budget amendment in June which appropriated \$60,000 for the purchase of this unit. The truck was currently on sale and the price was reduced to \$34,995, which was well under what Council approved. To purchase this used vehicle, Council must approve a resolution to waive the State's bidding requirements as per RCW 39.04.280(1)(b) when the "purchases involving special facilities or market conditions." The resolution must include information regarding the used vehicle such as mileage, vehicle condition and vehicle price. He presented an email from the State Auditor supporting the purchase utilizing this RCW process.

Discussion took place.

On motion by Councilmember Everett, second by Councilmember Diaz, the C.O.W. moved a resolution waiving the requirements of the State bid law to allow a purchase involving special facilities or market conditions to the July 26, 2022 regular meeting for consideration.
